

WHAT IS PAROLE? WHAT WAS CHNV?

Parole allows someone to enter the United States on a temporary basis for an <u>urgent humanitarian reason</u> or for a <u>significant public</u> <u>benefit</u>. INA 212(d)(5)(a)

Case-by-case Parole

Usually, people apply for parole at the port-of-entry at the border, asking for entry to the United States for a compelling reason.



Categorical Parole

CHNV was a "categorical" parole program – meaning that people who applied from the four countries through a specific form, were granted two years of authorized presence and work authorization.

The goal was to offer people from those four countries a lawful way to come to the United States to avoid them crossing unlawfully at the border.



532,000 people used CHNV parole


The program was ended by the Trump Administration





Biden Discontinues

October 2024
Biden says they will let program expire.
Recommends folks seek other forms of relief.



DHS Tries to End the Program

March 25, 2025
DHS Issues a Notice
saying that program will
end on April 24, 2025



Court Intervention

April 14, 2025
District Court issues a
"stay" blocking DHS
from terminating status
or work permits while
case is proceeding



SCOTUS

May 30, 2025
Supreme Court lifts the stay and allows DHS to continue



DHS Notice

June 12, 2025
DHS Issues Final Notice
saying that CHNV parole
is terminated as are the
work permits.

June 20, eVerify notifies employers of termination







WHAT IS TPS?

Temporary Protected Status is designated country-by-country in 18-month increments, and it depends upon an assessment of the conditions of that country as to if it is safe for national to return.

If you are already in the U.S., you are allowed to remain here without fear of removal for those 18 months, and you get work authorization.



FASTEST WORK PERMITS

Here are the scenarios you can apply to get a work permit fastest







To stay in the United States, you need an APPROVED or PENDING application for relief or status



Family-based

Parents: LPR or USC
Spouse: LPR or USC
Child 21+: USC
Sibling: USC

Qualifying Relationship – Use Form I-130 Petition

If you entered the U.S. on CHNV, apply for residency with Form I-485 Submit both at the same time and ask for work permit under category (C)(09)

If you entered unlawfully, you must consular process





To stay in the United States, you need an APPROVED or PENDING application for relief or status



Cuban Adjustment

For Citizens or
Nationals of Cuba
who have been in
the U.S. for 1 year or
more

- You lawfully entered the United States (i.e. on parole)
- You have been physically present in the U.S. for at least one year
- You file Form I-485 while you are physically present
- You are "admissible to the United States"
- You deserve favorable discretion

Spouses or unmarried children under 21 of a native or citizen of Cuba who meets the requirements of the CAA can join, too!

Purpose: for parents, spouses, or children of USCs or LPRs who have suffered battery or extreme cruelty from that qualifying relative and with whom they have lived.

Benefits: pathway to residency without need for petition from other

Downsides: You must have lived with this person for some time

Benefits: pathway to residency eventually. Able to "waive" lots of issues.

<u>Asylum</u>

Purpose: for those who are fearful of returning to their home country

Benefits: eligible for work permit after 6 months; free application; path to residency after you win.

Downsides: You are only eligible to apply for a work permit 150 days after your application is received by the government.








A "REFUGEE" UNDER THE LAWS OF THE U.S.

"any person who is outside any country of such person's nationality or, in the case of a person having no nationality, is outside any country in which such person last habitually resided, and who is unable or unwilling to return to, and is unable or unwilling to avail himself or herself of the protection of that country because of persecution or a well-founded fear of persecution on account of race, religion, nationality, membership in a particular social group, or political opinion."






ELEMENTS OF THE DEFINITION





You are outside of your home country of nationality AND:







ONE YEAR BAR

365 days from last entry

EXTRAORDINARY

- Serious illness or injury
- legal disability (age / institutionalization)
- Ineffective assistance of counsel
- Maintaining lawful status (TPS, parole, etc.)
- Curing of prior filing defect
- Death or incapacity of close family member

*Reasonable time after



CRCUMSTARCES

Changes to You

Changes within your home country

What matters is that your eligibility for asylum has been impacted and your fear of return is newly valid.

THE FORM TO USE: FORM 1-589

Application for Asylum and Withholding of Removal (& protection under the Convention Against Tortue)



Include Corroborating Evidence

If it helps your case, include it!

Always Use the Most Current Form Verison





No Filing Fee

For the application as well as for the first work permit based on asylum (C)(8)

Tell your Whole Story

Make sure your form is complete, accurate, and giving specific, responsive answers


Time is of the essence: you need to act now before DHS seeks to remove you.


Do not wait - get started right away.
